

FCGC INCIDENT POLICY

BACKGROUND

The Fort Colville Gun Club bylaws provide for the suspension and/or expulsion of members. This policy describes possible incidents and the procedure for dealing with and documenting the same. This is not meant to be a complete list of scenarios, nor restrict the Club to only these remedies.

INCIDENTS

The term *incident* is defined as:

1. Damage to property, injury, threat of personal injury or property damage, assault, or accidental discharge of firearm.
2. Also included is intentionally discharging a firearm inappropriately. Examples include (but are not limited to): firing while not on the firing line, firing at non-approved targets, firing when an unsafe condition exists, not obeying the Range Safety Officer.

An incident may be:

1. An individual occurrence or event (e.g. refusal to obey Range Safety Officer).
2. Something that occurs in connection with something else (e.g.: an ongoing dispute between members/guests carrying over onto Club property or event).
3. An occurrence of seemingly minor importance, especially involving factions between which relations are strained and sensitive (i.e., Club property neighbors), that can lead to serious consequences.

POLICY


Club bylaws state, "Any member or guest acting in any manner that could endanger another person or Club property, will be ejected from the Club grounds. This action can be taken by Club members with the consensus of two or more Club members." This policy requires that Club members *actively* police and patrol themselves, other members, and guests to protect the Club, the public, and each other.

All incidents will be documented and filed with the Executive Board, usually directly with the Secretary, within three (3) days. Forms will be kept with each range log book and filled out in ink. The names and contact information of all parties involved and witnessing the incident will be entered legibly.


Club bylaws further state, "Repeated violation will be sufficient grounds for the member to be suspended until the situation can be resolved by the Board of Directors." Repeated violation is hereby defined as two (2) or more times; this applies equally to members and non-members.

EXECUTIVE BOARD APPROVAL


This policy is approved and adopted by the Executive Board effective January 9, 2014. Club bylaws require a quorum of at least four (4) members.






